





Chateau Rampeau

The AOC Sainte Foy Bordeaux lies to the east of the city of Bordeaux and is near the border to Bergerac and Duras, right at the end of the Entre Deux Mers AOC. The appellation was created in 1937 and only qualified sweet white and semi sweet (Moelleux) wines at this time. However since the 1990s it has covered red wines as well. Sainte Foy Bordeaux has a great deal of rustic charm, is small in size and low in production, but does produce some lovely wines, including elegant Clarets, that are bargains. Chateau Rampeau has raised the bar and this region is starting to gain recognition.

Type of soil: Clay limestones, clay muddy

Varietals: 70% Merlot, 30% Cabernet Franc

<u>Dominant Flavours:</u> Forward red berry fruit, mid-weight tannins,

bright finish with lifted acidity.

<u>Vinification:</u> Traditional fermentation, temperature

controlled tank.
